

#### **PASTOR'S CORNER:**

I read one of the best explanations of hope in the Sheen anthology. Using the story of the two thieves to illustrate, Sheen said. "Hope is born first out of fear, then out of faith." Both thieves had hardened souls and a person with a hardened soul will not believe in God until "that awful moment when he has no one to deceive but himself." The thief on the left continued to mock Jesus; however, the thief on the right, at that awful moment, experienced spiritual growth born out of fear, then out of faith. This thief's reward for his belief was heaven.

Some of us may wonder if it was not too easy a path to heaven for the thief on the right. After all, he was a lifelong criminal with a hardened soul, and suddenly, he was saved. This statement from the Archbishop sums it up nicely. "In a single moment, a soul with a genuine fear of God can come to a greater understanding of the purpose of life than in a life-time spent in the study of the ephemeral philosophies of men." Sheen further notes that, while hope is uncertain, a reverential fear gives way to faith and hope.

When we think about this story of the two thieves, deathbed conversions do not seem all that strange. In fact, as any one person lays dying, we have no idea what kind of internal conversation may be going on between the created and the Creator. The Archbishop urges us though to avoid the extremes of presumption and despair. He says that presumption is an "excess of hope that forgets divine justice" and despair is a "defect of hope that forgets divine mercy." The takeaway message then is that reverential fear and faith gives us hope for favourable judgment.
